School times

Yard supervision begins at 8.30am and finishes at 3.pm. Students should not arrive to school before this time and should not remain at school after 3.15pm unless supervised by an adult.

OSHC

Challa Gardens Primary School operates a before school care session from 7.30am in the Gym. The cost for each session is \$5.

After school hours care is run by Brompton Primary School. If you would like to register for after school care please call on 08 8340 4486

Preschool

Challa Gardens Preschool is located on the Challa Gardens School Site.

The operating hours are from 8.00 am to 3.30pm. The Preschool has two groups, Group A which attends Monday and Tuesday and Group B which attends Wednesday and Thursday.

We also have a playgroup on Thursday from 9am-10.30am

Disability Unit

Seesaw

Assessment and Reporting

Challa Gardens Primary School aims to provide parents and caregivers with ongoing information about their child's learning. Sport

After School Programs:

Basketball

Our Basketball Program is supported by Woodville Warriors Basketball Club who provide coaches for our school teams. Players are expected to train once per week after school and play one game per week at St Clair Recreation Centre. The program runs during Term 1 and 2. All teams train Wednesday afternoons on school grounds. Games are played at St Clair Recreation Centre. Grades 2 and 3 play on Monday afternoons. Grades 4, 5 and 6 play on Friday afternoons. We run an Aussie Hoops Basketball Clinic for our Reception and Grade 1 students in Term 4.

Netball

Our Netball Program is supported by local netball clubs who provide coaches for our school teams. Players are expected to train once per week after school and play one game per week at St Clair Recreation Centre. The program runs during Term 1 and 2. All teams train Tuesday afternoons on school grounds. Games are played at St Clair Recreation Centre. Grade 2 play on Wednesday afternoons. Grades 3, 4, 5 and 6 play on Thursday afternoons. We run a Net Set Go Netball Clinic for our Reception and Grade 1 students in Term 4.

Soccer

Our Soccer Program is supported by Football SA which provide coaches for our school teams. Players are expected to train once per week after school and play one game per term in the Northwest Junior Soccer Association' School Competition.

The program runs during Term 2 and 3. All teams train Thursday afternoons on the school oval. Games are played at the St Clair Ovals on Broncas Avenue. All grades play on Saturday mornings.

Sport

SAPSASA & District Sports

Every year, students at Challa Gardens can compete in a variety of different SAPSASA sports competitions. Students from grades 4, 5 and 6 have the opportunity to participate in SAPSASA swimming and athletics carnivals. Both carnivals are held in term 1. Selected students from grades 5 and 6 that display outstanding skill in certain sports will be invited to try out for district state teams. The sports on offer throughout the year include soccer, Australian Rules Football, netball, cricket, tennis, hockey, golf and softball.

School Sports SA

Every year, Challa Gardens enters teams into School Sport SA's Knockout Competitions for soccer, netball and basketball. Try-outs and selections are completed at school. The selected teams then play against other schools until they are defeated. The Knockout Competitions are for students in grades 5 and 6 however, special exemptions can be made for students in Grade 4 if given approval from School Sport SA.

Swimming, Aquatics & Camps

Swimming, aquatics and orientation activities are a required part of the Australian Curriculum. Each year, students from Reception to Grade 5 participate in swimming lessons conducted by DfE swimming instructors. Our Grade 6 students are given the opportunity to attend Aquatics Camp.
